Day 1 1 st March, 2012 Thursday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrive in Hobart. Accommodation Hobart
Day 2 2 nd March, 2012 Friday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tahune Airwalk – The airwalk is a walk-way above the trees in the Picton Forest which finishes a cantilevered section over the Picton and Huon Rivers. There is also a bush walk which crosses the rivers on swinging bridges or a gentle ½ hour walk along the river. Accommodation Hobart – Breakfast and Lunch included
Day 3 3 rd March, 2012 Saturday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Salamanca Markets – Experience Australia’s oldest outdoor markets. The market has quality Tasmanian produce and a visit to Hobart is not complete without experiencing the atmosphere of this iconic area. • Mount Wellington – after lunch we will drive to the summit of this majestic mountain. (1270 m above sea level). There is the opportunity to do the Organ Pipes Walk. The views from the top of the mountain will be one of the highlights of Hobart. • Accommodation Hobart – Breakfast included. Lunch can be purchased from Salamanca Market.
Day 4 4 th March, 2012 Sunday	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mount Field and Strahan (West Coast) – walk to the base of beautiful Russell Falls and up to the Horseshoe Falls. Experience the stillness of a temperate rainforest. • We then continue on to Strahan and experience the outdoor performance of the “Ship that Never Was”. Depending on time it may be possible to go to the Hogarth Falls Walk. (40-45 minute walk) Accommodation Strahan – Breakfast and Lunch included

<p>Day 5 5th March, 2012 Monday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gordon River Cruise – Experience the majesty of the Gordon River part of the World Heritage area. You will have a short stop at the convict settlement of Sarah Island and a short walk through an ancient forest before returning to Strahan. This cruise is one of Tasmania’s untouched secrets. (Cost \$85.00 to \$95.00 each. Depends on number wishing to do the cruise) • Alternatively those not wishing to do the cruise will have the opportunity to travel to Rosebery for a 3 hour return level walk to view Montezuma Falls, one of the highest waterfalls in Tasmania. The track takes you to the base of the falls. Accommodation Strahan Breakfast and lunch included
<p>Day 6 6th March, 2012 Tuesday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strahan to Cradle Mountain - A relaxing day to soak up the ambience of this beautiful region of Tasmania. In the evening there is the chance to experience devils@cradle for those who wish to see and learn about the Tasmanian Devils or it is possible to go spotlighting (Evening tours optional extra \$25.00 each). Accommodation Cradle Mountain – Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner in the Cradle Mountain Lodge Bistro included.
<p>Day 7 7th March, 2012 Wednesday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cradle Mountain: We take a walk around Dove Lake, one of Tasmania's most iconic destinations. This 6km. Track is one of Tasmania's premier walks. It will take you right around Dove Lake and beneath the towering spires of Cradle Mountain. The track is board walked for part of the way. Accommodation Cradle Mountain. Breakfast and lunch included.
<p>Day 8 8th March, 2012 Thursday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cataract Gorge Launceston – We leave Cradle Mountain and travel to the country town of Sheffield (town of Murals). We have short stop at Ashgrove Cheese and travel to Cataract Gorge where you will have the chance to ride the Longest Chairlift in the World across this beautiful gorge. Accommodation Launceston. Breakfast and Lunch included.
<p>Day 9 9th March, 2012 Friday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Launceston to Bicheno - We travel to the picturesque seaside town of Bicheno. Pristine white east coast beaches. • Travelling to the Douglas-Apsley national Park for a 2-3 hour walk to the Apsley River Waterhole and Gorge (Level 3 walk with uphill sections). • Time permitting there is a lovely short walk with wonderful views of the beautiful granite coastline signposted to the blowhole. (Optional Extra penguin viewing tour \$25.00 each) Accommodation Bicheno. Breakfast and Lunch included.

<p>Day 10 10th March, 2012 Saturday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Experience the beauty of Tasmania’s East Coast including the stunning Bay of Fires. • Enjoy walking along beautiful white beaches with the chance of being the only people on them. <p>Accommodation Bicheno. Breakfast and Lunch included.</p>
<p>Day 11 11th March, 2012 Sunday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wineglass Bay – Freycinet National Park. Once there it is possible to walk to the look out of Wineglass Bay. “Wineglass Bay is one of the top 10 beaches in world according to Lonely Planet”. For the really energetic it is possible to walk into Wineglass Bay itself. (2 ½ hours return) or the Hazards Beach Circuit (4-5 hours return). • Those not wanting to do this walk can do the Friendly Beaches walk (5 minutes to 5 hours depending on how long you feel like walking or explore some of the other beaches in the Coles Bay area. <p>Accommodation Bicheno. Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner included.</p>
<p>Day 12 12th March, 2012 Monday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Leave Bicheno and travel to the spectacular Tasman Peninsula. We will stop at Pirate’s Bay Lookout, Devils Kitchen, the Blowhole and Tasman’s Arch. From here you have the chance to do the 3.4 km return Waterfall Bay walk following the spectacularly rugged cliffs of this area. • (Optional extra is the Port Arthur Historic Ghost Tour cost \$25.00 each) <p>Accommodation Port Arthur. Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner included. Final night together.</p>
<p>Day 13 13th March, 2012 Tuesday</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tour the Port Arthur Historic Site including a 20 minute cruise to the Isle of the Dead. • Say farewell to Tasmania
